**PURPOSE**

The purpose of the NTI is two-fold:

- To provide new teachers and experienced teachers new to Lasallian apostolates a brief, but meaningful introduction to the life and times of St. John Baptist de La Salle and to the Lasallian heritage and mission worldwide;
- To offer presentations and small-group discussions on the practical dimensions of teaching, especially for those who are new or relatively new to teaching.

The longer program is focused on those who are new or relatively new to the teaching profession and the shorter program (August 2-3) is focused on those educators who are new to Catholic Lasallian schools and other centers of education.



**DESCRIPTION**

As the theme of the N.T.I. may suggest, the roles of the Lasallian teacher are complex and challenging. The N.T.I. aims to shed a great deal of light on these roles for the new teachers: to become “effective” educators through immediately useful instruction and dialogue on current issues in education, and to become “affective” educators through exposure to the faith and zeal of St. John Baptist de La Salle and the ensuing Lasallian heritage. The new teachers, after just four days together, will leave with a clearer understanding of the commitment necessary to teach well and a better sense of their responsibility to “touch the minds and the hearts” of their students.



Building on the success of the past ten years of the N.T.I., we will offer in the summer 2010 more small-group mentoring according to subject area and educational site-specific instruction. Consequently, not only will the participants benefit from the many insights and perspectives of the experienced staff and diverse panelists, but also from time built into the schedule to address individual concerns and to begin formulating

actual plans for the upcoming year.

Here is a sample of just some of the topics that will be covered: *the characteristics of a Lasallian school, lesson and long-range planning, classroom management, knowing your students, matching learning and teaching styles, school cultural, professionalism, and taking care of oneself.*
